

# Optomize AB Conflict Minerals Policy

## Background

Many of our products contain various metals, including tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold (commonly referred to as “3TG”), which originate in mines around the world. The 3TG metals have become known as “conflict minerals”, much of which is sourced from the Democratic Republic of Congo and adjoining countries (“Covered Countries) where a decade-long civil war has being waged. This conflict has been exacerbated by various groups fighting to control mines and transit routes used in the trade of these minerals.

The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (“Dodd-Frank Act”) requires public companies in the US to file annual reports with the US Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) beginning in May 2014, disclosing whether or not they are using 3TG metals originating from the Covered Countries.

## Our commitment

To serve our customers better and in line with our company policy of creating products in an environmentally friendly, ethically correct and economically efficient way, we are determined to comply with international requirements regarding conflict minerals.


Optomize AB is committed to ensure that 3TG metals, if present in our products, is sourced with due respect for human rights, the need to avoid contributing to conflict and the desire to support development through our supply chain practices.

We expect our suppliers to source only from conflict-free smelters and to help us determine conformity on an annual basis. If we determine that our expectation is not met, we will work with the supplier to enable conflict-free sourcing.

## What we ask of our suppliers

We expect our suppliers to perform due diligence on the source and chain of custody of minerals used in the manufacturing of products they supply to Optomize AB. Suppliers’ due diligence measures should be available to us upon request.
